Temperance movement	Ban the sale and production of alcohol Believed alcohol corrupted men, caused domestic violence, destroyed families	Founded WCTU (women's Christian temperance union) Marched, rallies, lobbied legislatures Eventually led to passing the 18 th amendment - prohibition	No – growth of speakeasies, bootlegging, and the rise of organized crime (Al Capone) 21 st amendment repealed prohibition
Women's Rights	Equal rights with men Equal pay, jobs, athletics	Formed NOW (national organization of women) Lobbied congress for legislation, protests Civil rights act of 1964 – prohibited discrimination based on gender Title 9 – Guarantees equal funding for sports Tried to pass equal rights amendment, was not ratified	No – inequality in average pay, number of CEO's, no female president, maternity leave

Progressive	<p>Fix the abuses from the industrial revolution (low wages, long hours, poor working conditions, child labor)</p> <p>Increase democracy (increase people's ability to influence gov't)</p> <p>Protect consumers (unregulated food and drug industry)</p>	<p>Child labor laws, minimum wage, safety regulation</p> <p>Secret ballot, 16th amendment direct election of senators, 19th amendment women's suffrage, initiative, referendum, recall</p> <p>Meat inspection act, Pure food and drug act</p>	<p>Yes – Reduction in accidents, child labor</p> <p>Increase in people's influence in gov't</p> <p>Increase in quality of food, accurate ingredients in food and drugs</p>
New Deal	<p>Provide relief, recovery, and reform in order to bring country out of Great Depression</p>	<p>WPA – provided jobs</p> <p>Social security – Provide assistance to unemployed, elderly</p> <p>TVA – Built dams, schools, parks</p> <p>FDIC – insured bank</p>	<p>No – WW2 brought us out of the great depression</p> <p>Did provide relief and recovery</p>
