What to expect in this class:

- * **Homework:** Types of assignments will vary. We will occasionally be “flipping” our lessons and thus watching a video might be required. Be prepared for homework throughout the school week.
- * **Vocabulary**
 - o Define- we will be completing 30 vocabulary lists this year based on common terms from the
 - o Regents Exam.
 - o Multiple Choice Questions- These will accompany each week’s vocabulary list.
 - o Quizzes- Typically, our Vocabulary Quizzes are matching
- * **Thematic and DBQ Essays:** They’re required for the Regents and thus they’re required for class. We will be working together to improve your comfort level and skill with essay writing.
- * **Quizzes and Tests:** Exams will include a variety of question types such as matching, multiple choice, short answer and essays. Most frequently tests will be created using questions from previous Regents Exams. Additionally, there will be a large test at the conclusion of each 5 week period. There will be a two day in-class midterm which will be a significant part of your 2nd marking quarter grade.

Grading:

We use a cumulative point system for each quarter. Each assignment is given a point value. You will accumulate points based on your completion and quality of work. This grade is written as a fraction. At the end of the quarter the total points that you accumulate is added up and is divided by the total possible points you could have earned and is multiplied by 100.

Assignment	Points Earned	Points Possible
Homework	8	10
Essay	38	50
Quiz	27	30
Test	78	100
Total	151	190

Example:
Points earned/points possible=
 $151/190=.79$
 $.79*100=79$
The student’s average is 79

Class Participation: How to earn points

- ✓ Be present
- ✓ Be on time
- ✓ Pay attention
- ✓ Take notes
- ✓ Be respectful

How points are taken away:

- Being absent without an excuse
- Being tardy
- Not paying attention (head down or sleeping)
- Not taking notes
- Having your cell phone (or any other electronic device) visible without permission

***Each class period you have the opportunity to earn 3 points. At the end of the week we total your points. This is a SIGNIFICANT portion of your class average!

***If we see an electronic device being used without permission, you will lose all participation points for the class period and will face school level discipline
